# INTRODUCTION 1

## The Lewis Family

The bulk of the records in this collection relate to Hugh and Eveline Lewis, their children and grandchildren. Hugh Lewis (1860-1921) was the son of Lewis Lewis (the younger, 1819-1889) and grandson of Lewis Lewis (the elder, 1791-1861). Lewis Lewis (the elder) took over a tannery in Newtown, which was to become Lewis and Son, from Richard Davies in 1829. It was located behind no 5 Severn Square in Newtown, in which the Lewises lived until Lewis Lewis (the younger), having made a considerable fortune after the American Civil War, built a new tannery beside the old one, and leased Newtown Hall from Wastel Brisco - who later asked the family to quit, as he wished to lease the Hall to Sir Pryce Pryce Jones. The family then moved to Mount Severn in Llanidloes.

After Lewis Lewis' death his widow, Jane, daughter - Mary Jane (known as Jeannie, Shannie or Adie) - and son, Hugh, moved to Glan Hafren at Penstrowed, just outside Newtown. Hugh Lewis studied at Cambridge, then returned to Newtown to help his father run the family business. In 1895 he married Eveline Griffiths, the first Headmistress of Newtown County Intermediate School for Girls, where Hugh was a Governor. They lived at Glan Hafren after their marriage (Mrs Jane Lewis and her daughter having moved to a house called St David's, in Milford Road, Newtown).

# **Eveline Griffiths**

Eveline had Griffiths on both sides of her family. Her father, Captain Thomas Griffiths, was the son of Richard Griffiths, an Excise Officer at Welshpool. Richard Griffiths and his wife died young, and Thomas and his siblings were brought up by their grandfather, Moses Griffiths in Solva, Pembrokeshire. Eveline's mother was Martha Perkins, whose mother was a daughter of the Reverend James Griffiths. There are records relating to Martha's cousins, Medina Sarah and Ernest Griffiths, in the collection. Thomas and Martha lived in St David's, Pembrokeshire, and had 5 other children, as well as Eveline: Arthur, Peter Osborne, Thomas Meyler, Richard Elliot, Margaret [Annie], and Samuel Rupert. Eveline studied at the University College of Wales, Cardiff, obtaining a first class honours degree from London University - the University of Wales was not permitted to award degrees to women in 1892. She went on to gain an MA, and was appointed in 1894 to her post as Headmistress of Newtown County Intermediate School for Girls.

## Hugh and Eveline's Children

Hugh and Eveline had 3 daughters and 2 sons, one of whom, Hugh Griffith Lewis Lewis, died just before his eleventh birthday. The other children were: Katherine Medina (Medina or Dina), who did not marry, and lived with her mother; Janet Ellen (Eiluned, Luned, Bittie or Bits), who wrote several books, including *Dew on the Grass* - she married Graeme Hendry, and wrote the column 'A Countrywoman's Notes' for *Country Life* for many years; Eveline Mary (May), who married Maurice Bushell; Hugh Peter Meredith (Peter). Medina and her mother ran the tannery after the death of Hugh Lewis until Hugh and Eveline's only surviving son, Peter, took over, after studying at Cambridge and the Leathersellers' College in Bermondsey. Peter purchased Milford Hall in 1936 and moved there from Glan Hafren with his mother and Medina. He ran the tannery, with a break during the war years when he served in the Royal Welsh Fusiliers, attaining the rank of Major. He wrote several books: *The Land of Wales* - together with his

sister Eiluned, *A Foxhunter's Anthology* and, in later life, the family memoirs *Eveline* and *Tannery Tales*. He also served as a JP, County Councillor, High Sheriff and Deputy Lieutenant for Montgomeryshire. He married Barbara (Bobbie) Dugdale and they had four daughters, Ruth Evelyn, Janet Diana, Elizabeth and Sarah Medina (Sally). It was they who generously donated the collection to Powys County Archives.

Hugh and Eveline Lewis played a large part in the life of Montgomeryshire. He was High Sheriff in 1902/3, Chairman of the County Council from 1910 to 1918 and a JP. Eveline was also a JP and a County Councillor. Both were very involved in the Montgomeryshire Liberal Party; they were liberal in all senses of the word – in their espousal of causes such as the League of Nations, and their involvement in the arts. In the 1930s, Eveline helped the Davies sisters of Gregynog, to organise the County Music Festival, which saw such conductors as Adrian Boult, Sir Henry Wood and Sir John Barbirolli conduct massed choirs from as many as 21 different communities in Montgomeryshire. Hugh and Eveline also had many writers and artists as friends.

# Friends of the Lewis Family

## J M Barrie and the Llewelyn Davies brothers

The collection includes some letters to the Lewis family from the author of *Peter Pan*, J M Barrie. There are also letters from Michael, Peter and Nico Llewelyn Davies. They were three of the five sons of Arthur and Sylvia Llewelyn Davies. Barrie befriended the boys and adopted them on the death of their parents; they were the inspiration for the lost boys in *Peter Pan*; Barrie even used the name of one of them for his most famous character.

## George Meredith

Another author who was also a family friend, and godfather to Peter [Hugh Peter Meredith], was George Meredith. He held strong views on education and, because of his influence, Peter was not taught to read until he was 7.

# The Sudeleys and Lord Joicey

In the 19<sup>th</sup> century, Gregynog Hall belonged to the Hanbury Tracys, who were later ennobled as the Sudeleys. Eric Hanbury Tracey was Hugh's best man, at his wedding. The Sudeley family lost money in the Newtown flannel industry and, in 1894, sold the estate to Lord Joicey. He kept the estate, which extended to 18,000 acres, until 1914, when he sold it to David Davies of Llandinam.

#### The Davies Sisters

In 1920, Gregynog Hall was bought from their brother by Gwen and Margaret (Daisy) Davies, the wealthy grand-daughters of David Davies of Llandinam, one of Wales's richest self-made men of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The sisters, and their brother David (1<sup>st</sup> Lord Davies), were brought up at Plasdinam, outside Llandinam. David was elected Liberal MP for Montgomeryshire in 1906. During the time they were at Gregynog, the sisters made the Hall a centre for the arts, and entertained many famous writers, musicians and artists. They were eclectic art collectors, and their collection of paintings, including many Impressionists, is now held in the National Gallery

of Wales in Cardiff. On the death of the surviving sister, in 1963, Gregynog passed to the University of Wales.

## Other Friends

Robert Gibbings was the author of several books on English and Welsh Rivers, such as *Coming Down the Wye* and *Sweet Thames Run Softly*. While writing the book on the Wye, he rented Glanrhyd, Marsh's Pool, Llangurig, from the Lewis family – living there for about 2 years.

Ralph Peacock was originally an illustrator, but later in life he took up portraiture and specialised in society portraits of women and children; he painted portraits of Hugh and Eveline's children.

Stuart Rendel was a wealthy industrialist, who was also Liberal MP for Montgomeryshire from 1880 to 1894. Whilst in the constituency he lived at Plasdinam. He was made a peer in 1895, and took the title of Lord Rendel of Hatchlands.

# Arrangement of the Records

Because the collection spans several generations of the Lewis family, the records are arranged by generation. Thus, Lewis Lewis the younger, the first family member for whom there are records in the collection, is listed under the heading 'Lewis Family - First Generation'. Hugh, his sister Mary Jane, and his wife Eveline, are listed as the second generation. Records from Eveline's paternal and maternal families (both, confusingly, Griffiths) are listed among the records relating to her. The records relating to properties owned by the family are listed after the fourth generation, followed by business records (Lewis and Sons). The final section consists of records which do not relate directly to the family, or which it is not possible to identify as such.

Both branches of the family followed the Welsh tradition of using each other's second names. They also used abbreviated names, which seemed to mutate over time; thus, Hugh's sister Mary Jane was variously Jeannie, Jeanny, Adie or Shannie. Records relating to a specific person are headed by their full name, with the name used by the family in square brackets; a note of their relationship to other family members is also included, sometimes with short biographical details.
