The greater part of this deposit was received in near chaos. As

such it was unusable and there was a considerable amount of duplication: draft and rough drafts of deeds and wills and several copies of certain posters and sales particulars. Duplicates have been destroyed, or, where the item related to adjoining English counties, sent to the appropriate record office. The records have been placed in two main series (boxes 1 - 11) according to person and (boxes 12 -) according to place. It seems likely that most of the records were once filed according to client, but in some cases it has not been possible to identify the client or it has been deemed wasteful to allocate time spent in reorganising the 'place' category.

Readers should be aware that papers relating to a particular person or property may be found in either category.
