Brecon, in the 18th and early 19th centuries. The bulk of the volumes were transferred to the Library service. Two of those volumes, and item 2 below, were probably once the property of David George. The George family of Brecon left several tombstones in the churchyard of St. John the Evangelist, Brecon, and one of the family, Aneurin George of Mount St., was churchwarden of St. John's for 50 years (he died in 1909 aged 79) and this may explain why item 1 is to be found in this collection. This led to a lawsuit against William Williams (and Rees Williams, Howell James and John Parry, his servants and workmen) on behalf of Thomas Pitchford the Elder and Thomas Pitchford the Younger, tenants at Frwdgrech Farm. William Williams also claimed right to a stream of water on the Held Farm (property of Charles Morgan, bart) by redirecting the course of the stream over a field called Cae Cyd (part of Wernddu Farm, belonging to himself William Williams).

William Williams and John Church came to an agreement whereby William Williams would pay all costs of the court case and relinquish all claims to rights of way and streams to the said John Church. The lawsuit was discontinued and John Church conveyed to William Williams a close of land called the Upper Fedw (part of Frwdgrech Farm) to be used by William Williams as a roadway.

But there are also payments for tea tickets and 'at the door', which might be related to a society or chapel.

The book had a great deal of plaster dust loose in the folds of the book and coating the pages; there are also lumps of plaster stuck to the cover. There is extensive damp and rodent damage – one corner having been eaten away.

Copy of *Llanthony and Mission News*, vol 1 no 1, Jan-Mar 1894, published by the community founded by Father Ignatius, at Capel-y-Ffin.

Father Ignatius (the Revd Joseph Leycester Lyne) is remembered for his efforts to restore monastic life to the Church of England, as well as for his considerable success as a mission preacher.

Gladstone regarded him as one of the greatest orators of his day; the atheist Bradlaugh declared Ignatius the only man whose influence he feared upon his followers.

In 1869, having failed to persuade the poet Walter Savage Landor to part with Llanthony Abbey, Ignatius acquired a tract of mountainside above Capel-y-ffin, and began building a monastery. Loosely based on the ruined priory at Llanthony, it was designed by Charles Buckeridge. Monastic life continued there for forty years, until shortly after Ignatius' death in 1908.

Ignatius travelled widely at home and abroad, notably in North America, attracting vast crowds to his mission services. His motto 'Jesus Only' symbolised his simple, direct message. Francis Kilvert describes Ignatius in his Diary as "a gentle man of simple manners - a very fine head and brow and entirely possessed by his one ideal."
