This collection relates to the Rev. Evan Evans, minister at the Calvinistic Methodist chapel at Cefn Gorwydd between 1896 and 1932.

Originally from Bwlchyllan, Ceredigion, Evan Evans became a minister at the Cavinistic Methodist Chapel at Cefn Gorwydd, along with the chapels of Llangammarch, Hermon and Libanus, in 1896. He was minister at the Chapel for 36 years until his death in June 1932. He also published a book on the life of the musician John Thomas of Llanwrtyd in 1926. He was buried on 30th June 1932 in Gorwydd Chapel. The collection comprises notebooks (in Welsh) outlining his sermons [1896-1932], a mounted photograph of the Reverend, and a copy of his obituary that appeared in the Presbyterian Church of Wales official handbook for 1933-1934.

This freehold stock rearing farm, comprising the house, outbuildings and approximately 150 acres of meadow, pasture, arable land and woodland was bought freehold from Mr John Jones, who had farmed in for many years, by Sir Daniel Thomas Davies KCVO, and Lady Davies, of 36 Wimpole Street, London, in 1960.

In 1960 the house had no running water, internally, and no electricity. The house required considerable work to bring it up to date, running water obtained from a spring on the hillside, and electricity and GPO telephone.

Since 1960, the farming has been limited to the grazing of sheep (until 2002) by Mr Lloyd of Gellelin.

On the death of Sir Daniel in 1966, the property passed to his widow, and on her death, to their elder daughter Lady Marion Dodds. In November 2002, Lady Dodds sold the property Mr & Mrs Parks.
