This volume contains at least three different sets of handwriting and the first part appears to have been marked by a teacher, so was presumably produced during the studies of a nurse. The inside cover includes the names and address of three nurses who may have been the authors – Nurse Millard of Bath, Nurse Blackman of Westfield near Battle and Rosa Page of Plaistow, London (later addresses for Ms Page are recorded as Defynock and Beulah). The inside cover also includes a reference to ‘A handbook of Nursing’ by MN Oxford of Guy’s Hospital and the notes in this book are presumably taken from it.
