With the Restoration he was imprisoned for refusing to take the oath of supremacy, and spent most of his last decade in gaol. Alexander Griffith, author of the Strena, was one of the dispossessed, having been deprived of his living of Glasbury on the grounds of "lasciviousness and drunkenness".
