Answer of Charles Lewis of Norton, gent and defendant in a bill c. of complaint brought against him by Prince Lewis of Norton, gent, his uncle in a dispute involving the estate of Hugh Lewis, deceased of Norton, the father of Charles and the brother of Prince.

Includes a household inventory including much pewter; tinware, including "one apple toster" and "one fish dropper"; three fowling guns (valued at £1 together); a dozen "old Turkey Chaires" in the parlour; and other domestic goods at Hindwell and Norton. Also farming produce including barley; rye unthreshed at Hindwell (worth £2 5s); oats at Norton; peas; and stock, including 600 sheep (£75, the largest element in the total)

Prince appears to have tried to defraud his nephew of property and is not satisfied with the judgement of the Consistory Court of Hereford regarding the authenticity of Hugh's will and as therefore decided to take the dispute to Westminster. Charles was granted letters of administration by the Consistory Court; although Prince was the executor named in the will. The document refers to Mornington Farm and Townes End Farm, presumably in Norton and estates called Rhullawr and Hendwall. Although undated it appears to be between 1705 and 1720. It refers to an agreement of 19 Jan 1705 and mentions Sir Herbert Croft, Knt; who died in 1720 according to Burkes.
