# B/D/X/33 Deposit of Records from Sheila Bailey, The Prya Acc 1290 Centre (Previously Mid Wales Hospital, Talgarth)

These records were transferred from Morgan Bruce Solicitors, Cardiff to Sheila Bailey, and subsequently deposited at the Archives in August 2000.

The Mid Wales Hospital, originally called the Brecon and Radnor Joint Asylum was opened in 1903 and Wern Fawr farm adjacent to the hospital site was utilised from this date.

In addition to these title deeds deposited by Mrs Bailey a large collection of records from the Hospital (B/H/2), including items relating to the running of the farm was deposited by Powys Health Authority in February 2000.

The whole exercise was an attempt to have a conveyance officially registered or recognised at a time when there was no land registry for the confirmation of title. Unfortunately the property is only ever described in a very stylised way and never named]
