Devises to 2 sons Richard and John Brick (joint executors) equal shares of freehold m., tmt. Etc. in occupation of David Saincot called Green Meadow, p. Llanbister, subject to £12 annuity to wife etc. Sons desired not to sell estate except to each other. Household furniture to wife. £100 each to dters. Mary and Anne, £150 to dter. Margaret at 12 Months after decease. All farming stock and crop, implements of husbandry and personal property to said sons after payment of legacies and £60 towards burying testator and wife.
