The Girl's Friendly Society was founded in England in 1875 by Mary Elizabeth Townsend to protect and support young working-class girls leaving their homes to take up urban employment. The principle of the Society was for older members to become associates to befriend and mentor younger members. Membership was available from the age of 12 but, from 1882, girls from the age of 8 could become candidates in preparation for membership. The GFS provided numerous facilities for its members, most important were the lodges offering cheap, good-quality accommodation to young women working in domestic service and as mill and factory workers.

These records mainly relate to parishes in the former counties of Breconshire and Radnorshire and to the Builth and Llandrindod branches in particular. Some records relate to Tredawel, a home of rest given to the Society by Miss Clara Thomas of Llwynmadog. Situated on Ithon Road, Llandrindod, it was run by Miss Georgiana Partridge who was also branch secretary of the Builth & Llandrindod branches.
